Christie Myer would like to establish three, if possible. i. Increase Jail Programming ii. Start Pre-Trial Release Supervision Program for those released on OR and/or are subject to modifications of bail or bail terms by January 1st. iii. Evaluate Outcome Measures on identified providers under AB 109 (as suggested by Lisa Bertolino-Mueting). Christie Myer also suggested a small working group be formed to examine what programs they want to be assessed. HHSA, Probation, and the Public Defender's office have each said they would send a representative to be a part of this working group. Approved without abstention or opposition. a.	Probation Department Update	DepartmentChief Myer presented and reviewed data from the AB 109 Report from October 1, 2011 through September 30, 2015.It is projected that there will be an additional 255 individuals released to PRCS Supervision during this next fiscal year for Tulare County.	
		There have been 3,670 applications for relief under Prop 47. These are individual cases and not necessarily individuals, as each individual may have more than one case. We have filed a response to 2,313 of those applications (effective August 5, 2015). Of the Court Orders we have received and processed in response to those hearings, 1,924 (or 86% of the total processed), were granted.	
		Drug Court has changed completely due to Prop 47. Sentences have been reduced. Felony terms are now a maximum of 3 and a minimum of 2. Misdemeanor terms are now a maximum of 18 months and a minimum of 12 months.	
		Pre-Trial Release Program is set to start January 1, 2016.	
		In conjunction with the Superior Court, the Automatic Dialer/Short Message Services Project will hopefully start in about 90 days.
